#### Elder Yard Unitarian Chapel

Elder Unitarian Chapel, Elder Way, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S40 1UR An unspoilt 17th century chapel (the oldest in Derbyshire), featuring original pews, altar and organ. Exceptional stained-glass windows plus a historical collection of Pearsons Pottery and various artefacts not normally available to see. Friday 9 September: 1000-1600 Saturday 10 September: 1000-1600 Sunday 11 September: Service at 1500 (1 hour) No booking required.

#### Explore Chesterfield's Museum Collection

Unit 1, Calow Brook Drive, Hasland, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S41 0DR Explore one of the museum's off-site stores. Hear how the museum looks after the items within its collection and the challenges involved. Saturday 10 September: 1100-1200 No booking required - just turn up at 1100.

#### Holy Trinity Church

Holy Trinity Church, Newbold Road, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S41 7PG

This church is the burial place of George Stephenson 'The Father of the Railways'. Visitors will be able to see his grave inside the church and the window commissioned by his son Robert. The building is Grade II and is of relatively recent construction -1837.

#### Newbold Parish Church

St. John the Evangelist Church, St. Johns Road, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S41 8PE Newbold Parish Church will be open to visitors between 10am-2pm on Saturday 10th and 17th September, with a guide available, a written tour and an Archive Exhibition. Refreshments will also be available.

#### Rose Hill URC / Conversion and Innovation

Rose Hill United Reformed Church, 22 Soresby Street, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S40 1JN Rose Hill URC is a multi-purpose site. It can be worship style, café style and is suitable for concerts etc. The Church was first opened in May 1823. Saturday 10 September: 1400 - 1700 Sunday 11 September: 1400 - 1700 Thursday 15 September: 1000 - 1300 Sunday 18 September: 1400 - 1700 No booking required.

#### Saints Augustine Church

SS Augustine Church, Derby Rd, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S40 2EP

The church of Saints Augustine was built in 1931 in the Lombard Romanesque style of brick and terracotta. The dedication is to two Saints Augustine - Augustine of Hippo and Augustine of Canterbury. The church is only usually open when services and activities are taking place, so this is an opportunity to have a look around this iconic Chesterfield building and also see our historical archive. Saturday 10 September: 1100-1500 Saturday 17 September: 1100-1500 No booking required.

#### Spital Cemetery, Chesterfield

Spital Cemetery Lodge, 19 Hady Hill, Chesterfield, Derbyshire, S41 0DZ
